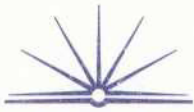


## Question 16

### Groups in context

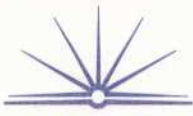
a) The location of resources can affect employment in groups such as the disabled.

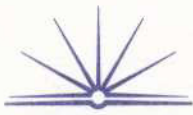
on the location of resources as these people may not understand where to find a specific thing needed to complete their job.

Homeless people do not usually have a very good sense of identity as they feel because they are homeless their families don't care so they don't care this makes them feel that no-one could ever love them or really care for them.

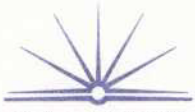


c) Two groups in the community that uses government strategies are disabled and chronically ill.

These two groups use government strategies for things such as transport to and from doctors, hospitals, specialists etc. These groups also use the government for things such as ramp  $\&$  in houses, rails along walls, nurses that come to the house, etc these things may cost the patient a little money but are mainly funded by the government.

The government uses the management process to help these two groups  $\&$  as they first plan  $\&$  to put new things in or get more helping nurses ect. They then organise with the patients, nurses or contractors for a relevant time to go to the house





village/nursing home etc. The government then puts the plan into action for example the nurse in the house or nursing home as an extra, or the ramps, rails etc to help with patients mobility. After these things have been done for a while the government evaluates how well this plan is going then reports back to the patient. The patient may agree or disagree the appropriate action is then taken.
