

(a) The social changes would include a reduction in socialisation and activities with friends and family due to the needs of the child. Parenting responsibilities include providing a safe and loving environment We The child, protecting The child from abuse and external danger, providing basic physical peeds, providing an education, and providing a possible role model for the child. A common goal for parent is to provide the child with all these factors to allow the childto develop and grow in a positive environment. boundaries through regolating with child. This allows be child to make mature decisions and haves a sense of responsibility. The child respects the parents fair attitude and tearns to communicate poubles onesneed to heparent. The parent has fulfilled their responsibilities in an aceptable manner. Through their parenting, The influences of their own up-bringing and experiences for example it they experienced a childhood with a reglectful garant who showed little responsibility and set no rules or guidelines for Aen. Deywould leath fram personal experience to improve their own paranting by showing responsibility and authority without being too demanding. Observing the parenting styles of other parents for example friends who show good authoritative parentry styles and communication with their children.
