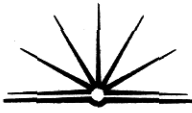


a) i) One change mentioned in the song lyrics is that the trees have been taken from outside and have been placed inside.

ii) Repetition is used in the song to get the point across. Alliteration is also used.

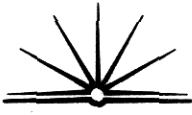
b) The cartoonist represents his attitude to change by the images which are the opposite of what we would normally see in comparison to the written part of this text. ~~The cartoonist~~
