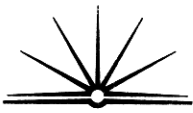

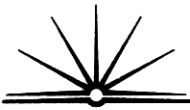


The Bush Tucker Man, is not only up to date with today's society he knows how to survive in the wild.
