the story & they also change one

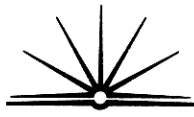
of the questions, while the article

After the story has been run, they find out the girl was dropped from the team due to bad form.

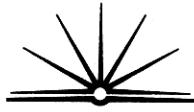
But now everyone thinks the teams are lesbians.

This changed his life in a huge



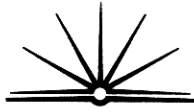
way.
