(a) i - They took all the trees and put them in a tree museum and they charged all the people a dollar and a half just to see them.

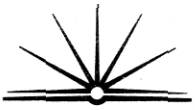
ii - No-one knows what have got until they lose it and noticing all the changes that have occurred over a short period of time. The changes that have happened don't seem to be great at all.

(c) The poet ~~the~~ communicates change through the



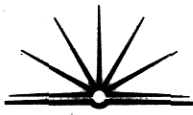
life of a tree and how it changes day by day. Also how we change day by day, getting older and we should live our lives in the sun just like the tree.
