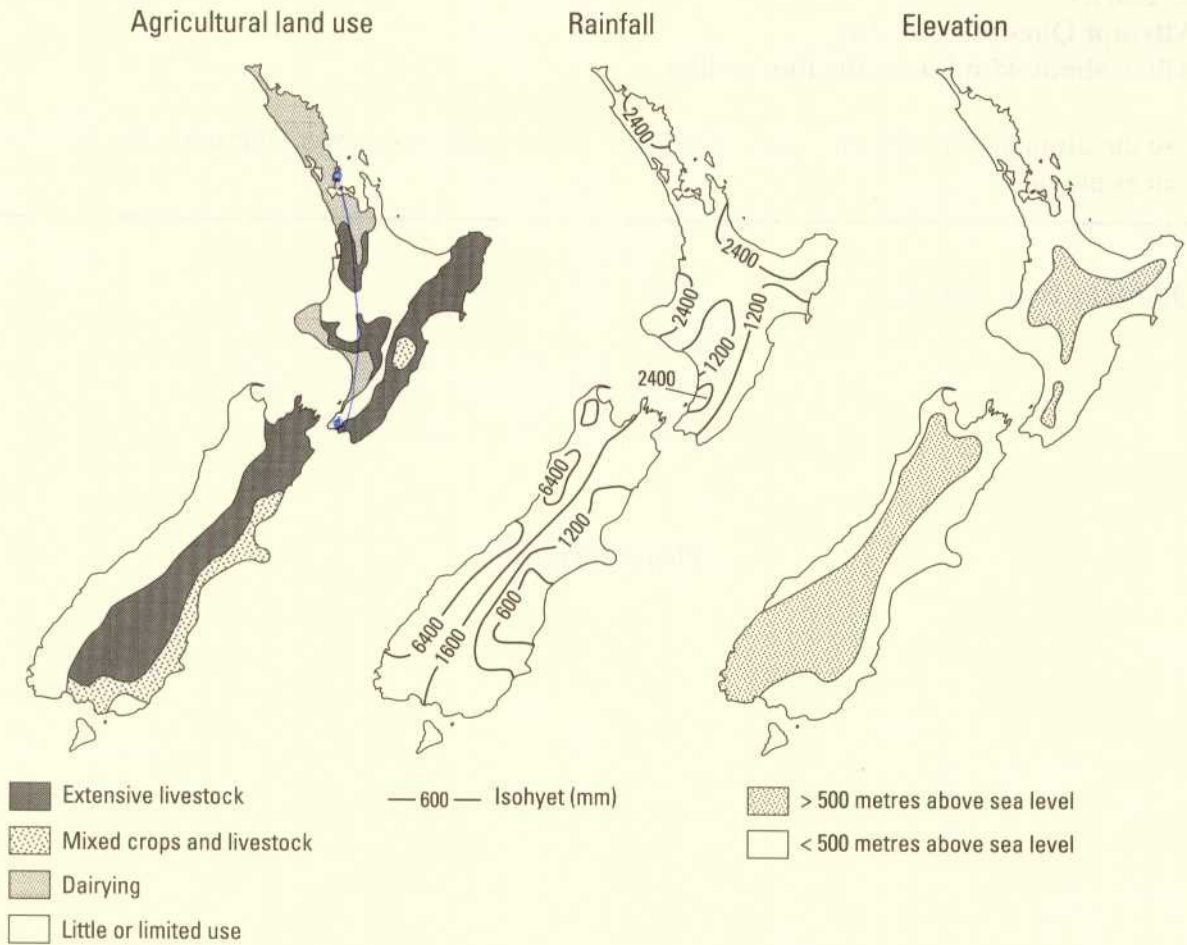


Question 16 (6 marks)

- (a) What are the land uses found along the transect from Auckland to Wellington? 2

- (b) Account for the distribution of agricultural land use in the South Island of New Zealand. 4

On the ~~left~~^{western} ~~board~~ side of the island there is limited use of land because rainfall is ^{very} high. In the middle of the island, extensive livestock occupy the land because conditions are more favourable - rainfall is much lower and is over 500m above sea level, meaning that agriculture will not be affected by salinity from the sea as much. On the eastern side of the island, mixed crop and livestock occupy the land. This is because rainfall is ~~not~~ suitable for
