Outline how the experiences of trench warfare changed soldiers' attitudes to the war over time.

During World War I, trench warfare caused a stalemate which was reasonably unknown before this time, it caused men to be generally in constant battle. War was soon to be seen as a way of killing than controlling. Source B shows how life for a soldier in constant battle can make you lose hope and even doing the simplest tasks could result in your death showing the fear that every soldier had for this war. Source D shows how battle was not the only thing weighing on a soldier's mind, trenches became slovenly places to live for they knew they would not last long, and the provisions were scarce they often burned objects they needed for warmth. In either case death was everywhere, and the soldiers were always against it.
