It was difficult to evacuate wounded men from trenches as seen in Source C, poorly constructed trenches were often narrow, there was the risk of enemy snipers and staying in one spot while attempting to lift a soldier meant vulnerability to artillery fire.

Outline how the experiences of trench warfare changed soldiers' attitudes to the war over time.

Like in source D, trenches often ~~AVA~~ declined in quality through bombardments, ~~weather~~ such rain and storms, which eroded the trenches into hazardous muddy ditches which posed the risk of drowning and bred disease. This led to soldiers feeling improving the trenches was a futile endeavour, and so there was a loss of morale, which was further bolstered by lack of supplies such as in source B where the soldier ~~graves~~ comments that the German soldiers were better equipped. In the year 1917, mutinies broke out, notably amongst the French.
