The use of drugs creates an artificial imbalance in their ability to do so & therefore undermines any true effort that may have been applied by other competitors as a result of an unfair playing field.

Furthermore, these drugs despite enhancing the ability of the athlete to perform with greater ability there are also severe health dangers associated with these drugs. For example, the use of HGH ^{human growth hormone} results in gigantism, bony overgrowths, heart disease, muscle weakness & diabetes ~~and~~ some of these conditions bear great risk to the athletes overall wellbeing & in some cases ~~in~~ life. Consequently, performance enhancing drugs are considered unethical due to the risk associated with the use of some of these products.

Finally, these performance enhancing drugs are considered unethical in their use by sportspersons who are viewed as role models by the rest of society.
