

Aboriginies experience many inequalities in human rights, identity, ~~an~~ and socio economic status and without proper education and reform their condition may get worse.

Aboriginies face many inequalities, which affect their power and authority.

Social class greatly impacts onto their power and authority as generally ~~the~~ the majority of Aboriginals are of a low socioeconomic status which leads to disruptive behaviour and poor conditions of living. Since they are of a low social class many Aboriginies resort to drinking and gambling, which, in turn, worsens their condition even further as society stereotypes and discriminates the Aboriginal minority as lazy and dysfunctional, thus creating difficulties for them to gain employment. Due to poor living conditions and lack of education Aboriginal children ~~are not able to~~

fall ill more regularly than other children and are unable to perform well in school which leads to a poor education and difficulty in gaining a job.

Aboriginal ethnicity is greatly discriminated against as it is the stereotype, due to their low socioeconomic status that ~~some~~ some of them are dysfunctional. People are unaware that their behaviour is not a reflection of their ethnicity but a reflection of their place in society, their condition. Due to this ethnic discrimination and ~~perceived~~ perceived stereotype, many employers are reluctant of employing Aboriginal people, which decreases their chance at gaining power and authority. Also as a discriminated ethnic minority it would be hard to gain acceptance by ~~the~~ society let alone than gain power and authority.

Power and authority is achieved through wealth, status, education certain social attributes. With Aboriginals facing such bad conditions of housing,

location, education and health due to their ~~low~~ social class it is not easy for them to gain access to opportunities such as education, due to low income, they cannot afford books, pencils or excursions, and health, if a member of the family falls ill they are unable to access health facilities due to its costs and ~~costs~~ ~~costs~~ in turn wealth, due to their lack of education. Wealth is also hard to access due to the prejudice they suffer through ~~the~~ negative stereotypes, ~~and~~ thus creating a bad perception of them by society and status is affected by their socioeconomic ~~status~~ conditions, their education, and job, and ethnicity.
