With little wealth, stutus of income Aborigines in general have tittle opportunity to goin higher social dasses , hence the continuity of enjoying little or no power or land authority in society Especially in the past, the ethnicity of Aborigines has contributed to their suppression and assimilation of their auture due to the ethnocentric viewos of white or non-thorging people. Since British settlement in 1788, policies such as protectionism, segregation and assimilation (including supression in reserves and as dometic servants) the has maintained dominent views of Aboriginal culture. Even after these policies were dismanted, discrimination

continued and continues today. During these the ethnoantric policies of the past, Moorigines has no power and authority completely supressed by recist tota non - Aboriginal perople. With the implication of self-determination policies initiated in the 1960's, discrimination has divamatically decreased, however steristypes and projudice towards Aborigines costinuty today . St With constant bigatry towards them as well as ethnocentrism, discrimination, set skridtying and prejudice, Aborigines & have difficulty in upward social mubility and scherefore are limited in their pouse and authority to change the present conditions, despite the Australian ideal of equitarianism With society's general negative view towards the minority group as well as being agoociated.

with a low social class, Aborigines & enjoy & much less to non- Aboriginal Australians. with extremely large imprisonment rates, no education, unemployment, lower life expectancy and health at levels compared to ltat of non. Aboriginal people, the minority group as a nhole do not drave the resources and power to change their present conditions. Therefore it is unlikely that they can acheive high levels of power anella authority in the Rubure

Prejudice is pre-concerved ideas that favour of are against cortain indeviduals or groups. In Australian Society, thorigines experience much prejudice which has been largely derived and continued as a result of enthrocentric and racist government policies previous to the self determination poficies them implemented at present. These views prave also been perpetuated by the media as regative reports considering their

low social class, poor living conditions and general health of the minority group, lower education, higher unengloyment and imprisonment rakes. The power of the media, institutional discrimination as well as negative idealogy of indeniduals in society towards the Minority group, Aborigines contributes to their seemingly subordinate status, hence having little power or authority as a minority group to overcome this situation. It is difficult for prejudice to dimish, especially is derived from discrimination and institutional discrimination as well as the media. For Aborigines to gain high levels of power and authority in society there barriers must be prochen, so social stutus and class can improve for Aborigines to be recognised. In conclusion, Aborigines generally being in low
