An example of both these occurrences is that of the Galiwir'ku garden and fishing boats. Primarily, one must understand the cultural differences of both Yolngu culture and Australian culture.

did the Yolngu face the challenge of maintaining the Galwintku garden once the missionaries left. The Yolngu was ~~was~~ unsuccessful, ~~that~~ at ~~this~~ this stage they were ^{facing} the self-determination actions.

Continuing upon the topic of the Galwintku, is also ~~that~~ the issue raised with the fishing boats, which was also an act of protectionism, which much like the garden, reversed into the act of self-determination.

The fishing boats was ~~was~~ an inspired action towards protectionism which took a turn for the worst, as when, once again the missionaries left the Yolngu to look after the boat business. In one night they managed to set all the boats aight, ending the business.
