2) The lines are slow, emphasising the seriousness of Aeneas' role.

iii) Virgil uses slow rhythm to emphasise the seriousness of Aeneas' new responsibilities. By calling him 'patrem', he emphasises Aeneas' fatherly position. By showing the feebleness of his father, Virgil shows Aeneas to have the main responsibility of leading his family into security. The destruction of Troy would have emphasised the responsibility he has to escape, and lead the survivors to a new life. The use of divine guidance, and the the emphatic Aeneas' responsibility.
